Studies of more than 2.2 million young people in the United States consistently show that the more assets young people have, the less likely they are to engage in a wide range of high-risk behaviors and the more likely they are to thrive. This power is evident across all cultural and socioeconomic groups of youth.

One of those 40 developmental assets is **Service to Others** where the child has opportunities to help others in the community. Today, youth and volunteers are looking for ways to serve their communities, and at the same time, service organizations need dedicated volunteer help. By working together, we can positively benefit in the development of young people, our communities, and the nation.
